COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS:

Mayor Twombly- In working with the state on the speed entering town at the south entrance, progress appears to being made. Several options are available inside the city limits, ex. flashing light, radar speed sign. The street & alley committee, Mayor Twombly and Attorney Collins will meet and bring back a recommendation at the July meeting. Mayor Twombly stated 20+ ton of cold patch was delivered after last meeting.

Attorney Collins – A roofing group met with Mr. Collins, asking the city to consider adoption or recommending a roofing standard code of installing an ice and water shield.

Clerk Karn – Council received an invitation to the Business Appreciation Breakfast, June 21, 2018, 7:30 a.m. at HCC Walters Wellness Center; preliminary numbers show a very slight increase in the general fund budget; and the city's sales tax revenue was up in January but down in March and April with a slight yearly increase at the end of May.
